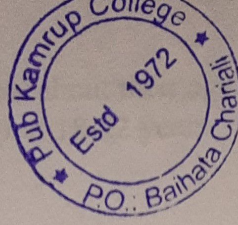

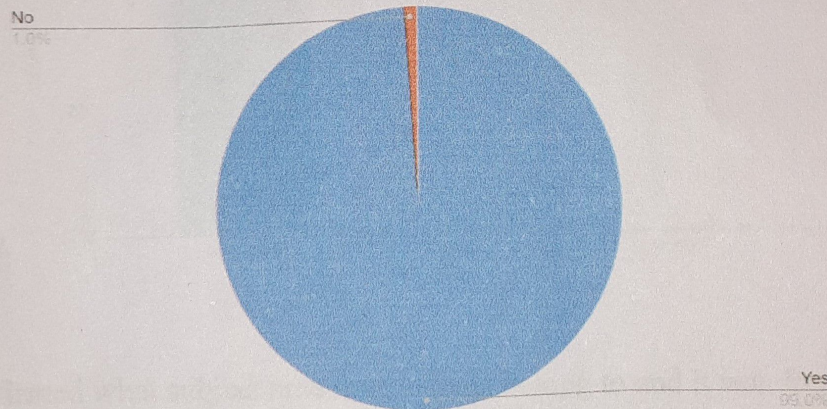
## INTRODUCTION:

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) is an accepted system for assuring overall sustenance and enhancement of quality in every aspect, especially the academic sphere of a college. For maintenance and enhancement of quality in any institution feedback is a vital part. The IQAC of Pub Kamrup College has made an assessment of students' satisfaction concerning teaching learning and evaluation. The Student Satisfaction Survey (SSS) was conducted online after the end of the academic session 2018-19. Altogether 618 students responded to the survey. All these respondents were from Under graduate programs. In the questionnaire altogether 26 questions were asked and out of them 21 were directly related to teaching- learning and evaluation. Students were many options to respond according to their level of satisfaction. All questions were required to be attempted compulsorily.

## Result and Analysis:

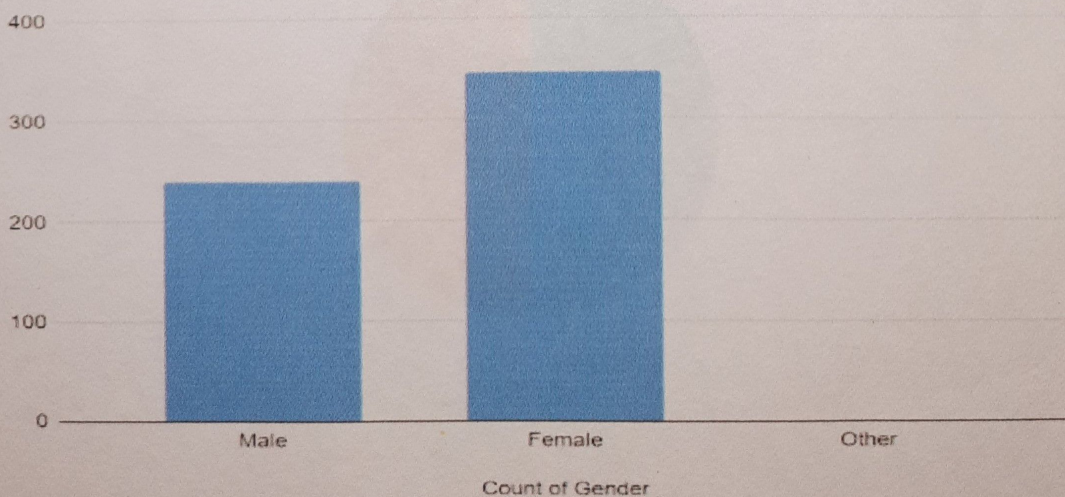
The first question was about to know students' experience of SSS, to which 99% replied that it was their first experience.

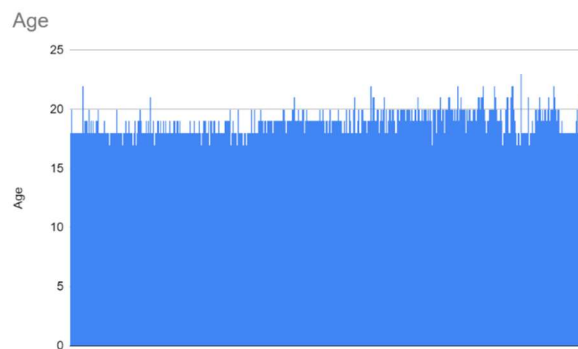


Question No. 2 was to enquire about participation of students on the basis of gender. It was found that 350 students were female and, the rest were male.

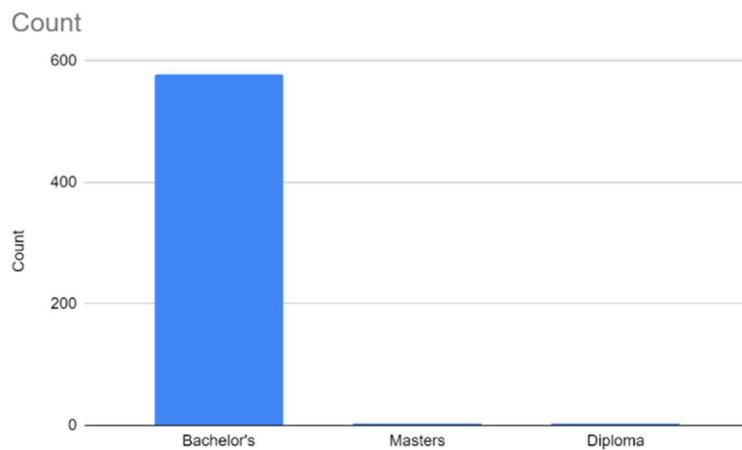
Count of Gender



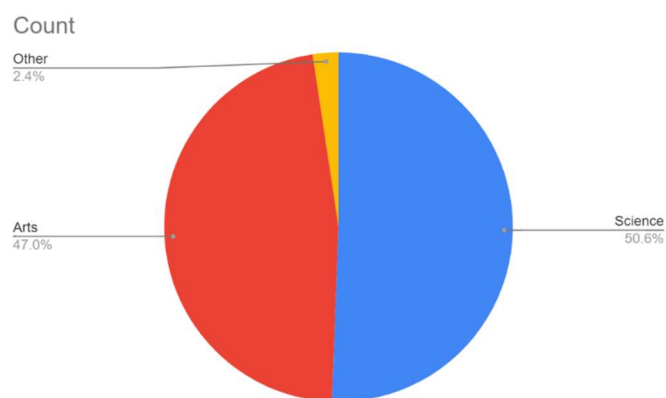
The third question was to know about their age and it was found that most of the students were in the age range of 18-22 years.

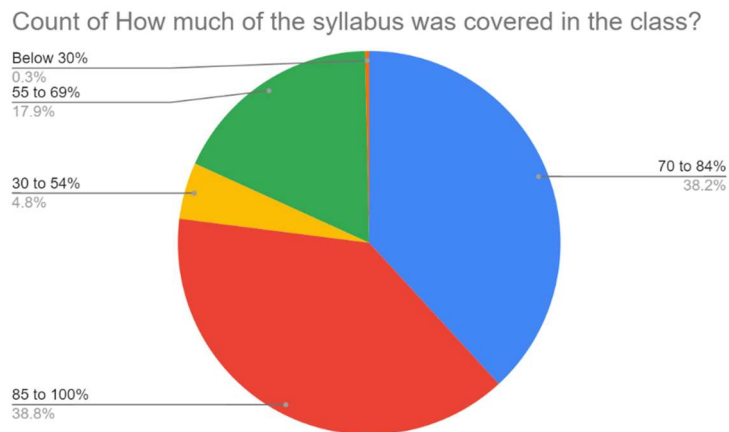

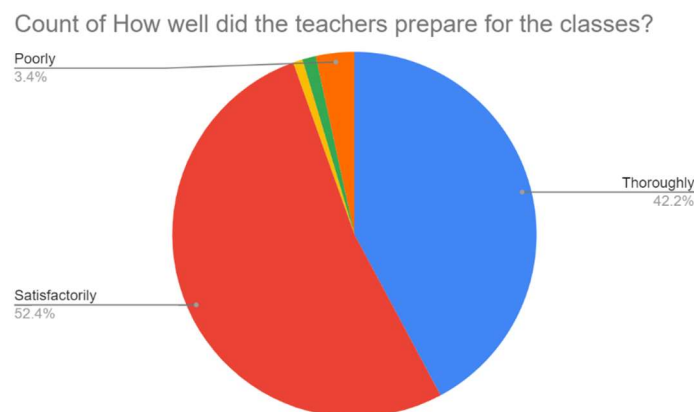

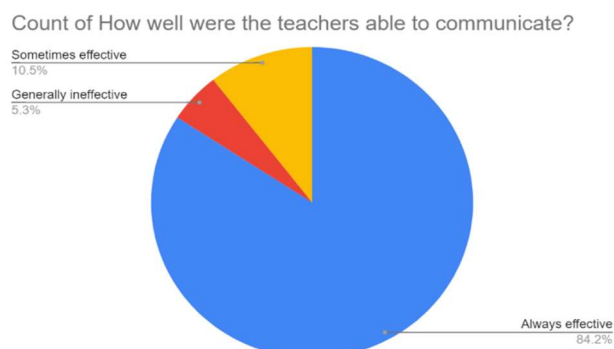
Question no. 7 was to know about the level of preparation on the part of the teachers while attending the classes. Responses have been shown in the following table.

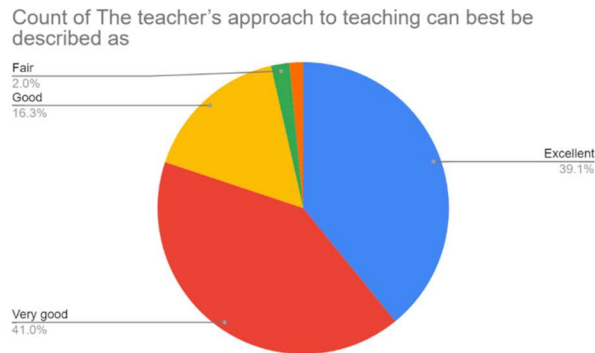
Question no. 8 was to understand teachers' level in communicating to the students. The result has been shown in tabular form.

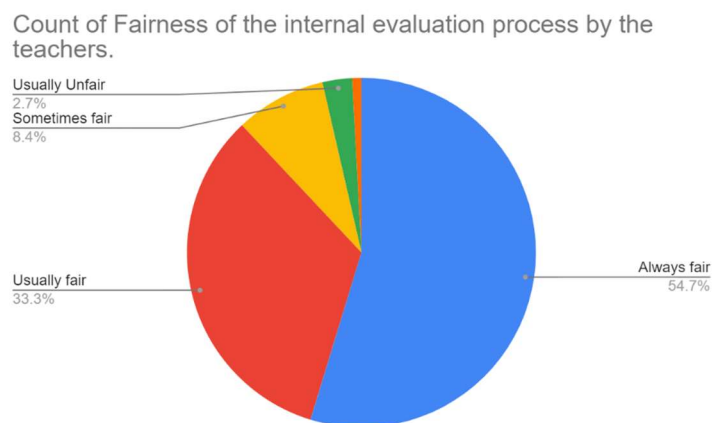
Question no. 9 was to understand teachers' approach to teaching. The result has been shown in tabular form.

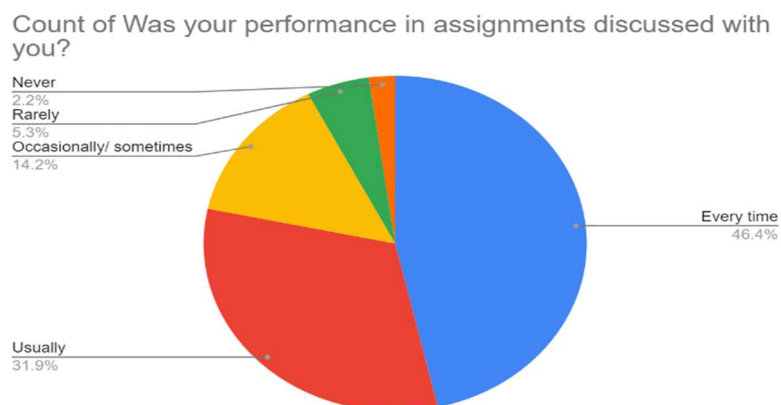
Question no. 10 was to understand fairness of the internal evaluation process by the teachers. The result has been shown in tabular form.

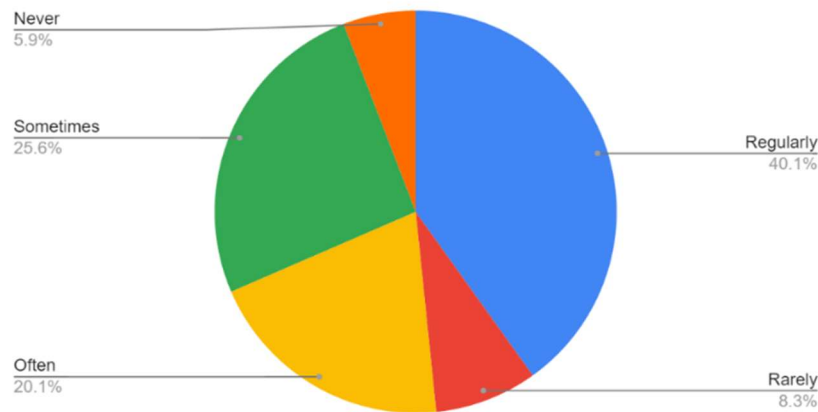

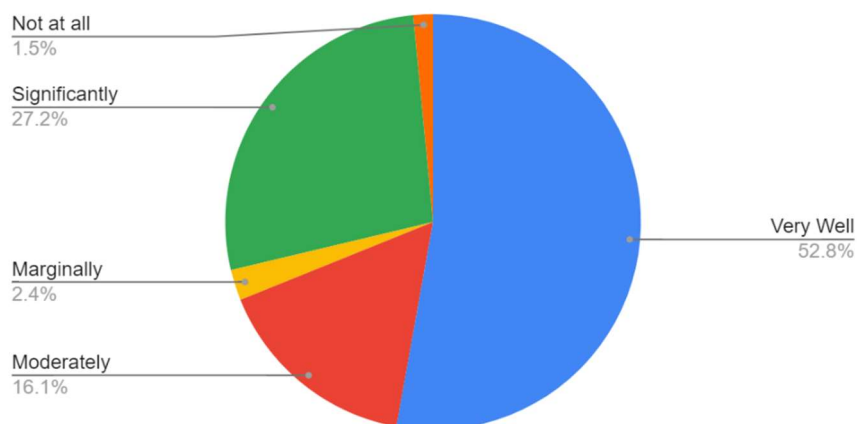

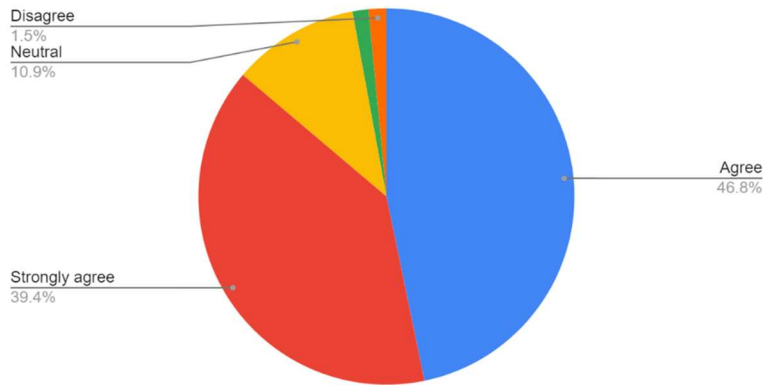
Count of The teaching and mentoring process in your institution facilitates you in cognitive, social and emotio...



Question no. 14 was to understand students' satisfaction level regarding how far the institution provides opportunities to learn and grow. The result has been shown below

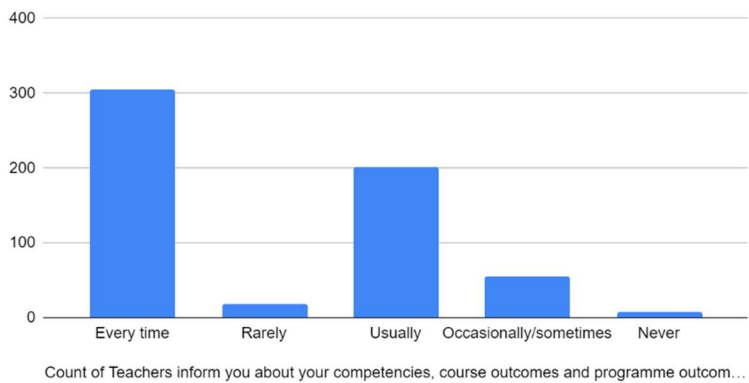

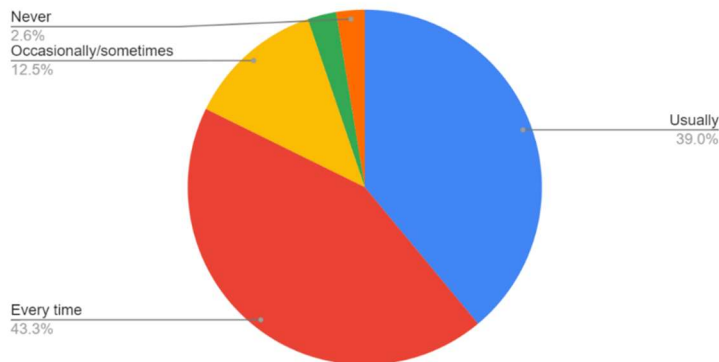
Count of Teachers inform you about your competencies, course outcomes and programme outcomes.



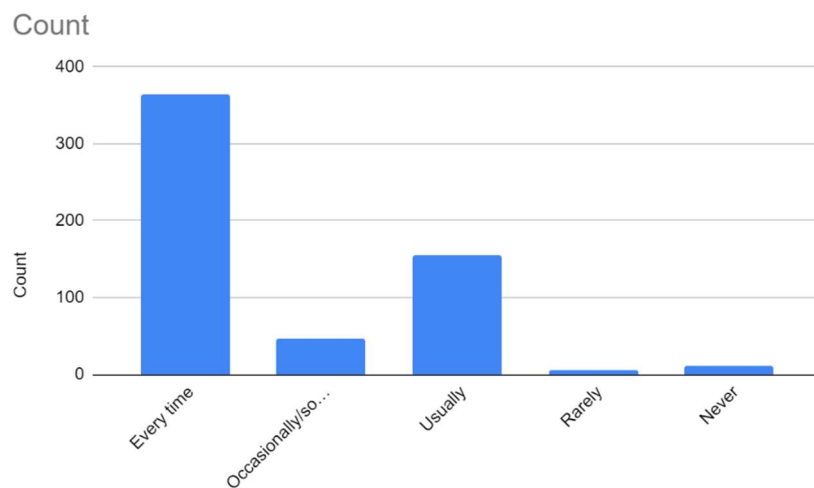
Question no. 16 was to understand the role of teachers as mentors. The result has been shown below.

Count of Your mentor does a necessary follow-up with an assigned task to you



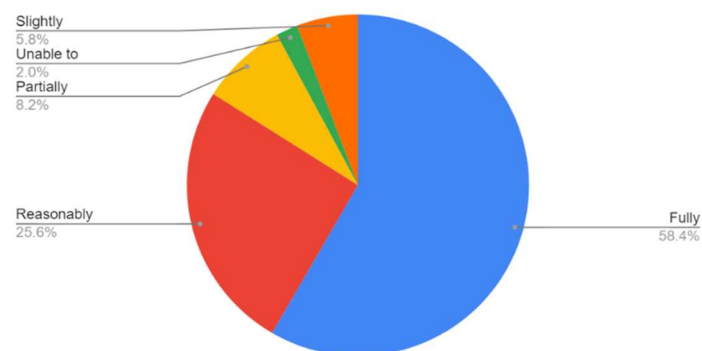
Question no. 17 to know how far the teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications. The results have been shown below.

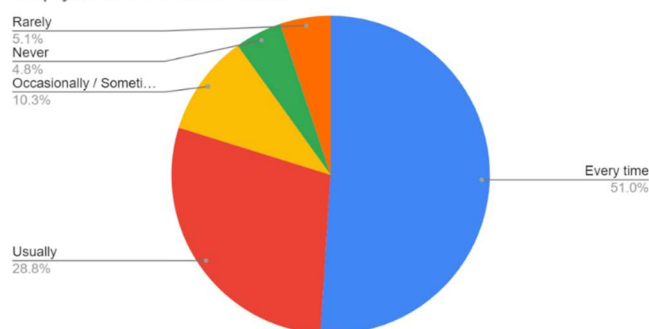
Count of The teachers identify your strengths and encourage you with providing right level of challenges.

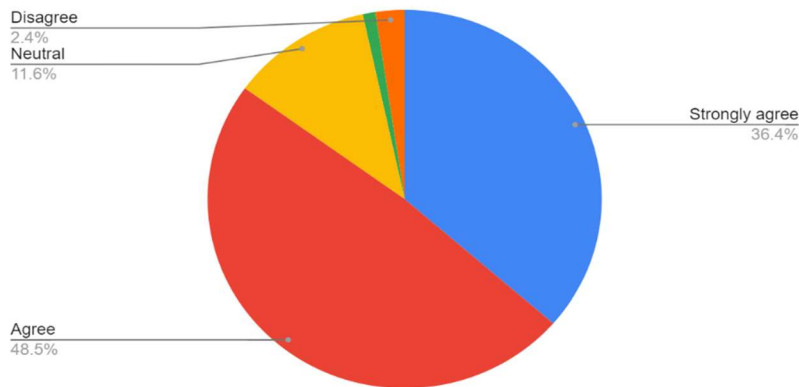




Question no. 20 was to assess how far the institution makes effort to engage students in the monitoring, review and continuous quality improvement of the teaching learning process.

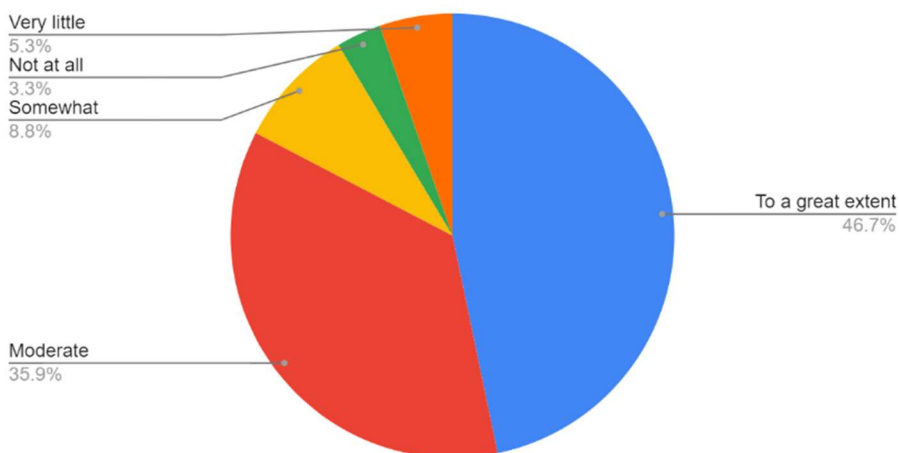
Count of The institution makes effort to engage students in the monitoring, review and continuous quality improvement of th...

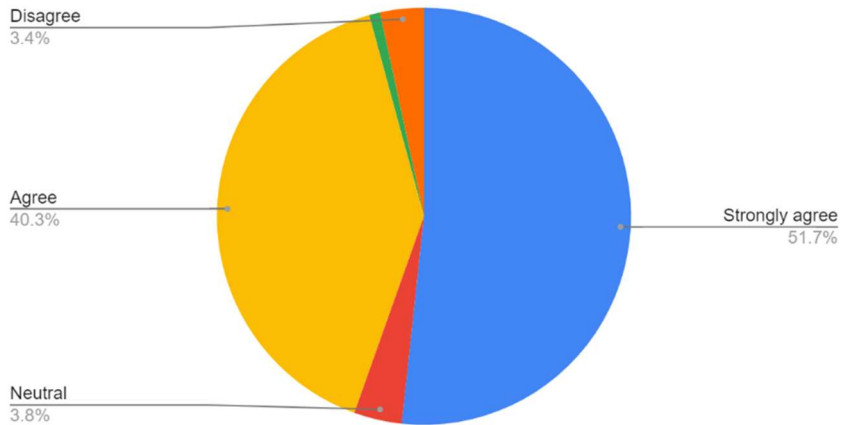

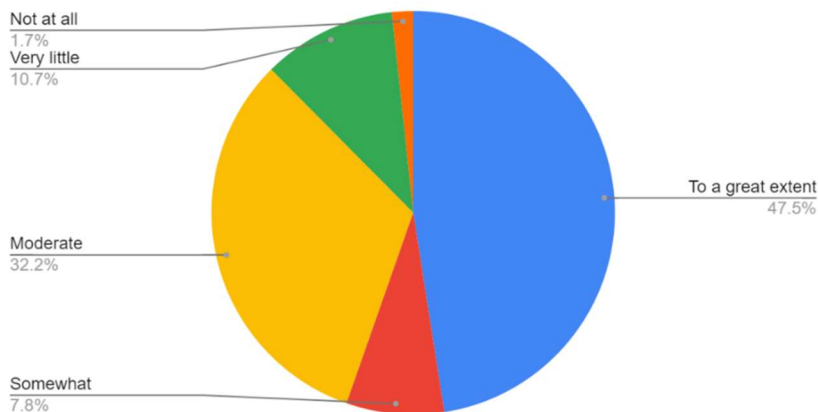
Count of Teachers encourage you to participate in extracurricular activities.

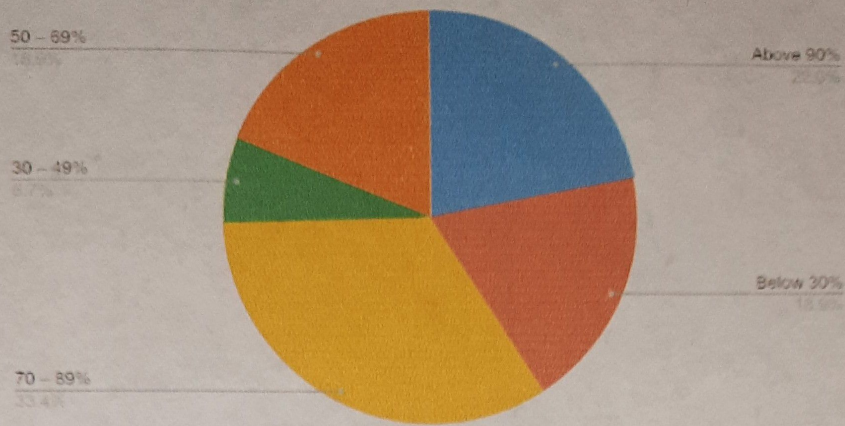
Count of Efforts are made by the institute/ teachers to inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skills to make you read...

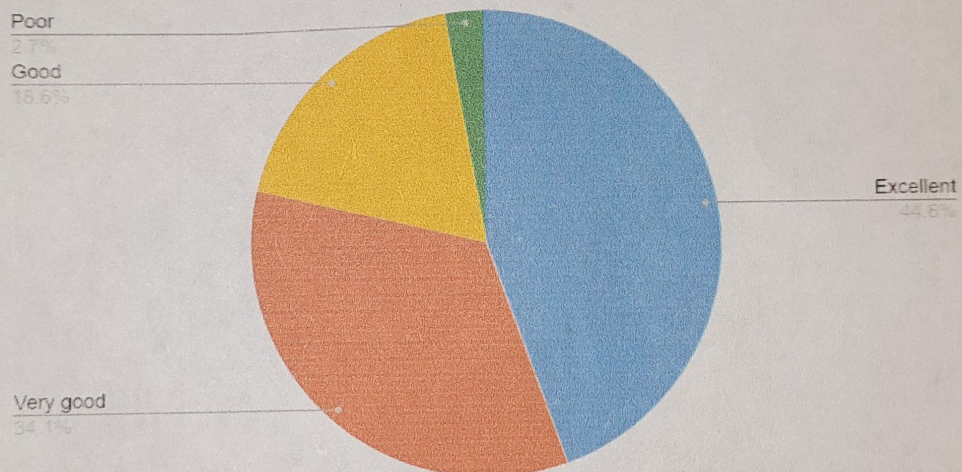
Count of What percentage of teachers use ICT tools such as LCD projector, Multimedia, etc. while teaching.

### Conclusion:

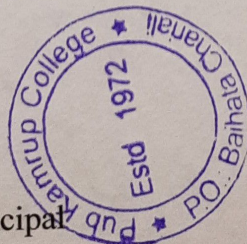
From the feedbacks from the students, it has been found that the college needs to focus more on teaching-learning and evaluation so that students can be satisfied more through overall improvement in every aspect.
