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• **1.00 THE COLLEGE** •

**1.01:** Pub Kamrup College, located at Baihata Chariali, Kamrup- Assam is an institute of general higher education. This College was established in 1972 as a result of decade-long popular desire and relentless effort for such an institute. The College fraternity as well as the locality at large is thankful to the concerned doyens for their able guidance and leadership in the act of initiation of the College. Started with arts stream, there are a total of 48 permanent teaching positions, additionally 25 Guest faculty members being engaged in all the three faculties- Arts, Science and Vocational Courses, and in a few professional courses in the College at present.

Baihata Chariali, though semi-urban in nature, is a busy centre of trade, academic activities, and of communication. It is the junction point of two National Highways- 31 and 52. The Madan Kamdev Devalaya (remnant of the 10th- 12th century shrine, now a govt. recognized tourist spot) is at a distance of 3 kms from the College.

Pub Kamrup College Library is an academic library and inseparable part of Pub Kamrup College, established in 1972, and has been serving its members from its inception. This Library is providing various services to its users and trying to expand the wings of its services. The total area of the Library is 342.74 sq mtr.

**Collection :** Pub Kamrup College Library tries to provide the users with the best sort of qualitative and quantitative documents that can be done with the available financial sources and supports. The Library holds 28000+ numbers of books accessioned in the register.

Besides its normal book collection the Library holds a number of e-resources. The Library subscribes numbers of national and regional News papers (Daily/ Weekly), Magazines etc. on regular basis. Moreover a number of rare manuscripts and other archival items collected and preserved in its Museum.

**(b) Science stream :** Physics, Chemistry/Logic & Philosophy, Mathematics, Biology/ Economics, Geography/ Statistics, Introductory Computer Science.

**B) TDC (Semester System) :** The Three year Degree Course in both the streams- Arts & Science consists of 6 consecutive semesters leading to the degrees BA & BSc

1. English is compulsory for students of BA/BSc (Major/General Course).
2. MIL/Alt.Eng. is compulsory for students of BA with General and Major Course.
3. There is no MIL/Alt.Eng. for BSc students.
4. For BA Major/General Course, a student shall have to choose two subjects (at least one subject must be Non-Language) in addition to MIL/Alt.Eng. Out of two, one subject may be taken as Major subject. Then other subject will be considered as 1<sup>st</sup> subsidiary subject and MIL/Alt.Eng. is taken as 2<sup>nd</sup> subsidiary subject. Again, in case of General Course, the two subjects (other than MIL/Alt.Eng.) will be considered as 1<sup>st</sup> Elective and 2<sup>nd</sup> Elective subject.
5. In case of MIL/Alt.Eng. (2<sup>nd</sup> subsidiary subject for BA Course) a student with Language Major will take a Non-Language or Language subject other than the subject he/she is opting major. For example, English Major will take other than Alt.Eng./ Elective English and Assamese Major will take other than Assamese.
6. Students offering Major Course in BSc will have to offer other two Elective (subsidiary) subjects.
7. Students offering General Course in BSc will have to offer three Elective (subsidiary) subjects.

### 9.03 SELECTION PROCEDURE FOR MAJOR COURSE

- Students are to apply for admission in Major Course in a separate stipulated form in triplicate.
- Selection in Major Course comes under direct jurisdiction of the department concerned.
- The students opting Major Course will be admitted on the date of admission according to the College admission procedure.
- To opt Physics (Major/ General), Chemistry (Major) and Computer Science the student need to pass in Mathematics in the HS level.
- Switchover from major to pass course is permissible only in 1<sup>st</sup> semester as per GU rule.

• 12.00 VOCATIONAL COURSE •

Pub Kamrup College has been selected in the first phase by the University Grants Commission (UGC) for starting the BVoc (Bachelor of Vocation) scheme. Being located at a rural region and at a close proximity from Guwahati, the college has selected two potential sectors where the BVoc aspirants can get employment and initiate entrepreneurial ventures after completion of their courses.

**12.01 BVoc in Food Processing and Quality Management:** Food Processing is a developing service sector as well as a challenge for the local agro-economy. The BVoc course has been suitably designed to induce food processing skills in the students with a special emphasis on recent quality management traits in the food industry, and to make the students sufficiently skilled for job roles in food industries. Education components on entrepreneurship traits and service management will also guide the students towards self-employment at individual or community levels.

**Industry partner:** Sunandaram Foods Pvt Ltd, Mongoldoi

**12.02 BVoc in Software Development and System Administration:** Software is the pulse of modern mechanized machinery systems. The need for efficient softwares is in plenty to cope up with the need for efficient automated machineries. Developing skills to design softwares for large-scale and day-to-day use will be the thrust area under this course. A sufficiently skilled student under this programme may develop personal software enterprises as a system administrator and provide technical support to companies, farms, e-machinery developing companies etc.

**Industry partners:** Damyant Software, Noida; SS Technologies, Guwahati

**12.03 Important features of the BVoc curricula:** UGC has provided much flexibility for the students under the three year under graduate courses with multiple exit facilities at Diploma (after 1 year), Advanced Diploma (after 2 years) and Bachelor of Vocation (after 3 years) levels. Suitable skill levels as per National Skill Qualification Framework (NSQF) and possible job roles in the respective job sectors as per the National Occupational Standards (NOSs) have been set accordingly for suitable employability of the students.

**Syllabus and assessment:** The syllabi for the two courses have been designed and approved by the Gauhati University. The annual assessment for all the three exit levels will be conducted by the respective Sector Skill Councils (SSCs) as identified and suggested by the UGC. The skill components will be accompanied by general subject components to create a holistic approach towards excelling the students for employment. Apart from the college, university and the respective SSCs, the college has signed Memorandums of Understanding (MoUs) with specified partnership industries who will also play dynamic role in conduct and assessment of the BVoc students.

The BVoc programmes are therefore suitably designed to impart **knowledge, skills, attitude and behavioural traits** to make a student “job-ready” at each exit level.

**Intake capacity:** Fifty (50) students in each course

**Eligibility:** HS (10+2) passed (any stream)

**Selection:** Primarily based on general merit. [Interview may be conducted if felt necessary.]

**Hostel Accomodation (For girls only) :** Only three seats are reserved in the College Girls' Hostel.

**Future academic opportunity :** Pub Kamrup College is planning to start MVoc (NSQF = 8, 9) courses in the two subjects and has obtained necessary permission from the Gauhati University

**13.00 Add-on Course :** An Add-on course is one that can be pursued pallarely with a UG course. Hence the clear indication stands – only a regular student of TDC of this college is eligible for such a course. The courses will be conducted in adjustment with the degree course classes without hampering the regular scheduled classes of the students.
